Setting the Scene prior to EO1110...

- Students English/Math placement based on EPT/ELM scores
- Remedial courses/units taken by FTF (ESM20/30/40)
- Developmental education across the CSU system





What is EO1110?

- Eliminates non-credit-bearing remedial courses in English and Math
 - Enhance Early Start programming offered to earn college credit in summer
- Revised placement for first-year students in English and Math courses (multiple measures)
- Implemented different course options for remedial English & Math (ex: stretch courses, support courses)





EO1110 Concerns

- Students un-prepared to be placed in college level courses
- Negative impact for students completing GE B4 & A2








GE A.2 English Placement at Entry






GE B.4 Math Placement at Entry






GE A.2 English Pass Rate in Year 1






GE B.4 Math Pass Rate in Year 1





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EO 1110 KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS

These key performance indicators (KPIs) align with Graduation Initiative 2025 performance goals and should inform Student Success discussions. There is space in the tables for fall cohorts entering 2015-2018; it is recommended that data for at least 2017 and 2018 fall cohorts are collected. Each KPI is disaggregated by multiple student characteristics to allow for meaningful institutional analysis. Campuses may wish to further disaggregate according to their particular interests.






EO1110 @ CSUF 2018-2019

- Underprepared students must be provided with credit-bearing courses to complete GE writing or math/quantitative reasoning (QR) requirement.
- Re-designed English and Mathematics courses include embedded or attached instructional support.
- Placement will be based on multiple measures and not Placement Test:
 - 4 Categories of placement: Category 3 & 4 are students who need additional support.
