2020 Occupational Trends and Outlook

This report explores trends and outlook in occupations within the counties surrounding California State University, Fullerton (CSUF): Los Angeles County, Orange County, Riverside County, and San Bernardino County. The jobs examined in this report exclude those who identified themselves as being self-employed. Understanding major trends and projections in jobs can help CSUF evaluate the long-term occupational outlook of careers for which CSUF is preparing their students. It can also be used to evaluate the potential impact of CSUF programs on students' post-graduation outcomes. The data used for this report have been compiled by Economic Modeling (Emsi), which utilizes various labor market data from government sources (e.g., US Census Bureau, Bureau of Labor Statistics), as well as real-time labor market data (e.g., job advertisements posted by employers, online profiles and resumes created by job seekers and students).


Trend in Jobs Within Service Region: Overview

There was a total of 7,502,518 jobs within the service region in 2020 (see Table 1). Almost two-thirds of the workforce were between 25 and 54 years of age (see Table 1 and Figure 1). The greatest percentage of the workforce was Hispanic (40%), followed by White (35%) and Asian (15%).

The four counties altogether experienced an 8% growth in jobs from 2015 to 2019, before experiencing a considerable decrease in jobs in 2020 (by 7%). This decrease coincides with the COVID-19 pandemic that resulted in the enforcement of stay-at-home orders. The number of jobs is expected to grow slowly, by 2.6% between 2020 and 2025.

Figure 2. Trend in Total Number of Jobs in Service Region




Figure 3 depicts trends in the number of jobs in service region by typical entry level of education. The greatest percentage of jobs continue to require less than a Bachelor's degree (72%), followed by Bachelor's degree (23%), Doctoral or professional degree (3%), and Master's degree (3%). This trend is expected to continue into 2025.

Trend in Jobs Served by California State University Fullerton

The next section focuses specifically on the trend in jobs that programs offered at CSUF can serve within CSUF's service region. It examines jobs whose typical entry level of education is at least a Bachelor's degree. The report utilized the program-to-occupation mapping Emsi developed based on the CIP-to-SOC crosswalk developed by the National Center for Education Statistics and U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics¹. The overview of programs section shows jobs that can be served by CSUF's programs, followed by sections showing the jobs based on typical entry level of education.

¹ Please note that this crosswalk may be broad in nature, and may not entirely reflect the career pathways that are relevant for CSUF graduates. Overview of Programs

Table 2 and Figure 4 show trends in jobs within the service region that can be served by degree programs (i.e., Bachelor, Master's, and Doctorate) offered at CSUF as well as those that are not served by CSUF programs. Table 3 shows the percentage of jobs that can be served by CSUF. The jobs represent those that identify Bachelor's degree or higher as typical level of entry education. About 84% of the jobs available within the service region are jobs for which CSUF can prepare their students.



Bachelor's Degree

Table 4 and Figure 5 show trends in jobs that can be served by bachelor programs offered at CSUF as well as those that are not served by CSUF programs. Table 5 shows the percentage of jobs that are served by CSUF bachelor programs. The jobs represent those that identify Bachelor's degree as the typical level of entry education. About 85% of the jobs available within the service region are jobs for which CSUF can prepare their students.



Master's Degree

Table 7 shows the percentage of jobs that are served by CSUF master programs. The jobs represent those that identify Master's degree as the typical level of entry education. About 90% of jobs available within the service region are jobs for which CSUF can prepare their students.



Doctoral Degree

Table 8 and Figure 7 show trends in jobs that can be served by doctorate programs offered at CSUF as well as those that are not served by CSUF programs. Table 9 shows the percentage of jobs that are served by CSUF doctoral programs. The jobs represent those that identify Doctoral degree as the typical level of entry education. About 76% of jobs available within the service region are jobs for which CSUF can prepare their students.


