
This event consists of a panel of scholars profoundly affected by the incarceration of Japanese-Americans during World War II. Arthur Hansen, Emeritus Professor of History, was one of the first scholars in the U.S. to focus his research on the incarceration of Japanese-Americans. Thomas Fujita-Rony, Professor of Asian American Studies, has spent his career exploring its aftermath. Craig Ihara, Emeritus Professor of Philosophy, was born in Rohwer Relocation camp where his entire family was held until 1945. Collectively they will speak on various aspects of this injustice and will answer any questions members of the audience might have after reading the book by George Takei.


