The World War Two atomic bomb project mobilized academic science for military purposes. But it also connected this scientific work with large-scale industry at the height of Fordism, or mass production. This paper examines the political economy of the Manhattan Project, and the significance of this model of military-industrial organization, for the development of American capitalism and science after the war.
