Fall will be different.....

What is Criminal Justice?

- Criminal Justice is the academic study of crime, law and the justice system.
- Criminal Justice is an interdisciplinary course of study within the social sciences.
- A criminal justice major is not a job training program. BUT it will provide you with the skills and experiences to be successful within the criminal justice and related fields
 - Critical thinking
 - Research and writing skills
 - Exposure to diverse perspectives and research

How can faculty help you be successful?

- Read your course syllabi
- Introduce yourself to your faculty
- Ask questions during class
- “Visit” faculty during office hours
- Reach out for help

School/Life Balance

- How many units do you plan to take?
 - 15 units per semester = graduate in 4 years
 - 12 units per semester = graduate in 5 years

Hours Dedicated to Outside Obligations (Work/Family/Commuting) Per Week	Recommended Maximum Number of Units Per Semester
0 – 9	14 - 16
10 – 19	13 – 14
20 – 29	9 – 12
30 – 39	6 – 9

- Studying: For each class that you take (3 hours), you will want to spend between 6-9 hours studying / completing class assignments per week.
 - Do not procrastinate
 - Do not “cram” in your studying
- Organization:
 - Schedule a set time for all your classes (even the asynchronous ones)
 - Use a calendar to help you stay organized

120 units are required for graduation

Complete your GE (42-48 units)

+ CRJU Major courses (39 units)

= 81-87 units

- Take courses outside of your major to meet the 120 unit requirement.

GE considerations for CRJU majors

- To satisfy your GE math requirement (Category B₄), you should enroll in Math 120 (not Math 110 or 115)
 - To satisfy your Upper Division GE Category B requirement, consider enrolling in SOCI 303 (Statistics for the Social Sciences)
- If you are interested in going to law school, you should consider registering for PHIL 106 to satisfy your A₃ requirement (Critical Thinking)
- CRJU 100 and CRJU 300 will satisfy the GE requirements for Category D₁ (Introduction to the Social Sciences) and D₄ (Explorations in the Social Sciences)

CRJU Major Requirements

- 7 Required Classes
 - CRJU 100: Introduction to Crime, Law and Justice
 - CRJU 300: Foundations in Criminal Justice *
 - CRJU 310A: Criminal Law
 - CRJU 315: Policing
 - CRJU 330: Theories of Crime and Delinquency
 - CRJU 340: Criminal Justice Research Methodology
 - CRJU 345: Corrections
- 5 Electives
 - 9 units must be at the 400 level
 - 1 Writing Requirement
 - ENGL 301 (College Writing) or 365 (Legal Research and Writing)
- CRJU 300 is a co-requisite for all 300-level courses and a prerequisite for 400-level courses

Internships

- Requires 120 units of work with a local agency
- Start applying for local internships the semester before you enroll in the class.
- Students can apply 6 units of internships towards the 120 units required for graduation
- CRJU 495: For internships in the CJ system: Dr. G. Brown
- CRJU 492: For prelaw internships: Dr. R. Castro
- Can also include the Washington DC Scholars program for CRJU placements: Dr. S. Stambough/Dr. M. Doucette

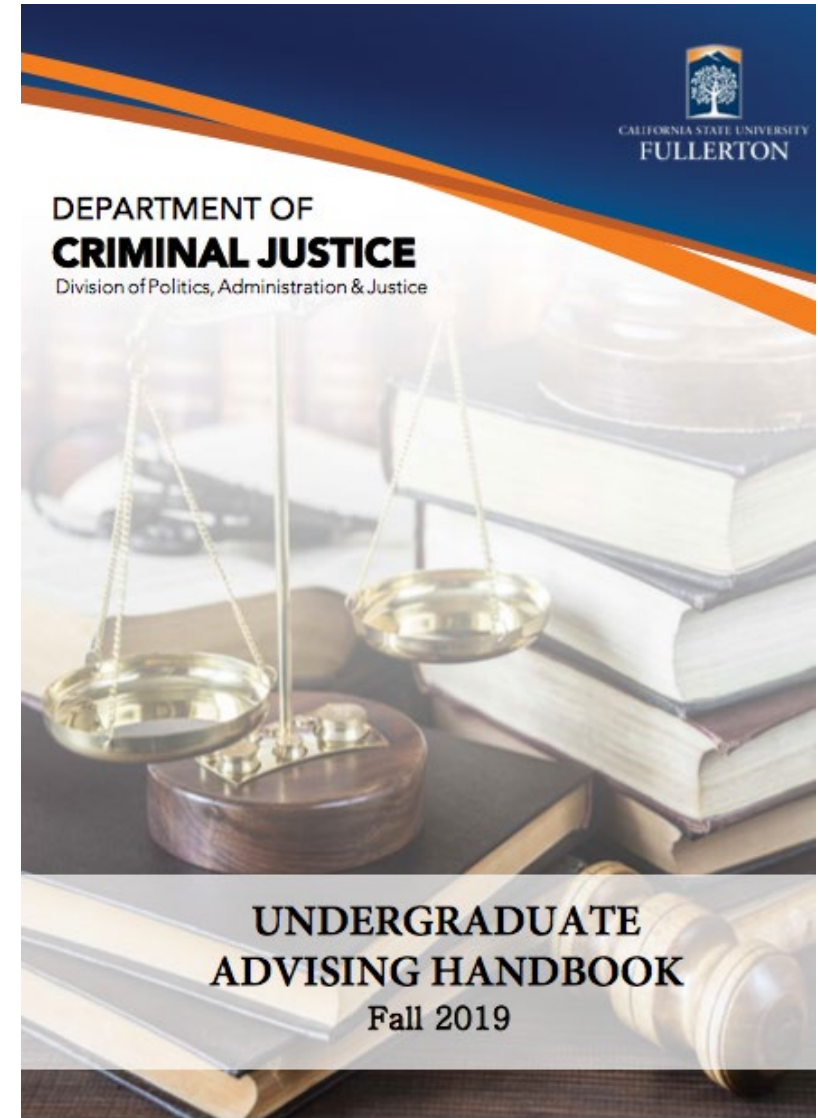
