- ► Conducted oral histories, sat on the Great Park History Committee, collaborated on two Farmers to Flyers exhibitions – one in the Fullerton Arboretum (2009) and one at the Orange County Great Park (2013)
- Multiple Oral History-Based Performances to veterans and their families
- ▶ In Fall 2018 students in Dr. Cawthra's class worked with the OC Great Park again on a new exhibition, A Brief History of the El Toro Air Show, 1950-1997
